Reception Good Level of Development 2026

Children will be defined as having reached a 'Good Level of Development' at the end of the Early Years Foundation Stage if they achieve at least the expected level in:

- The early learning goals in the prime areas of learning (personal, social and emotional development; physical development; and communication and language) and
- The early learning goals in the specific areas of Mathematics and Literacy

Year 1 Phonics Screening Check 2026

The phonics screening check tests a child's ability to decode words using only his or her phonic knowledge. It helps to confirm whether they have met the expected standard for the end of Year 1. The check is a statutory requirement for all children in Year 1 and takes place each year in the summer term. Children who did not take the check in Year 1, or who did not meet the expected standard, take the check again at the end of Year 2.

End of Key Stage 1 Assessments

There are no longer statutory assessments at the end of Year 2. Teachers now use the internal assessment procedures to monitor the progress and attainment of children which is used in the transition process into Key Stage 2.

Multiplication Tables Check

Children in Year 4 take a statutory online multiplication assessment to measure their fluent recall of times tables knowledge up to 12 x 12.

Key Stage 2 Assessments

Children in Year 6 take tests in maths, reading and grammar, punctuation and spelling. Teacher assessment judgements have been given in writing. The test results are given as a scaled score for each subject. A scaled score of 100 means a child is working at the expected standard for the end of the key stage.
